

Blessed To Be A Benedictine Oblate

I first heard about the Benedictine Oblate program five years ago when I was hired by the Benedictine Sisters for the position of Development Associate for the Office of Mission Advancement. I was eager to learn more about Benedictine spirituality and the Sisters' unique perspectives on the values of Balance, Care of the Earth, Community, Hospitality, Listening, Peace, and Prayer. I wanted to better understand The Rule of Benedict, which guides their daily lives, and has guided Benedictine communities for nearly 1500 years!

During the pandemic I began Oblate Initial Formation classes. Our group met virtually under those extraordinary circumstances. I looked forward to the reading assignments, monthly presentations, and discussions. I always felt enriched by the meetings, and still do.

I became an Oblate in May of 2022 and learning continues. There are monthly meetings, September thru May, for Oblates (in-person at the Monastery and virtual via Zoom), as well as Initial Formation in-person classes for prospective Oblates. I have worked closely with the Oblate Leadership Team, helping with Zoom meetings and twice presenting on Hospitality (one of my favorite values).

The classes wrap up in the spring and, after a time of discernment, there is an opportunity to make a commitment to become an Oblate (for Initial Formation candidates) or to renew one's commitment as an Oblate of St. Scholastica Monastery during an Oblation ceremony in May.

In this season of my life, I feel blessed to be a Benedictine Oblate, a lay associate of this beloved monastic community, while now working part-time with the Sisters. (For more information about the Oblate Program visit <https://boernebenedictines.org/oblates/>.)

Día de los Muertos A Special Tradition

Día de los Muertos is a Celebration of Life, the lives of those who have gone before us. It is a time to remember the stories they left us and intertwine our own stories with theirs.

Those stories begin to come alive in the preparation of altars (ofrendas) where the papel picado (cut out paper) is placed to allow the souls to enter into the familiar.

The altar is prepared on October 31st when the souls of the Angelitos, the children, return on Hallows Eve/All Saints Eve. Twenty-four hours later, on November 1st - All Saints Day, when the children leave, the adult souls arrive. November 2nd is celebrated for All the Souls in Purgatory.

On the altars, we place items to draw the souls to the altar and help them to cross over for their visitation.

These may include food and drink they enjoyed: a glass of water to quench their thirst from a long journey, salt in the shape of a cross also to quench their thirst and help purify them, and Pan de Muertos (bread), a soft sweet bread, dusted with sugar designed with circles and limbs to resemble the shape of a skull and crossbones.

Gravesites are visited and decorated with flowers (marigolds, calla lilies, cockscomb) and ribbons of bright colors and many other things like on our altars. The music, the chatter, the laughter and the tears are of joy as our loved ones' lives are remembered and celebrated.

Sister Mary Louise “Mary Lou” Hernandez, OSB

Perpetual Profession - August 6, 1983



Our Sister Mary Louise “Mary Lou” Hernandez, OSB, was born in San Antonio, TX to Juan Manuel Flores and Maria de los Angeles Rivas Garcia de Flores. She had an older sister and younger brother. Her paternal grandparents had seventeen children. This large, extended family was like its own community, which helped Sister Mary Lou easily relate to community life with the Sisters.

Sister started her career in bookkeeping at the very young age of nine when she kept a simple set of books at her aunt’s grocery store. After graduating from High School, she married and lived in San Diego, CA. She and her son, Richard, returned to San Antonio in the early 1950s. Richard attended Sacred Heart School and was taught by the Benedictine Sisters. This was where Sister Mary Lou got to know the Sisters.

Sister Mary Lou studied Finance and Accounting at the University of Texas at San Antonio. She worked many years in San Antonio at Bexar Meat Company and then Apache Meat Company before entering the Benedictine community in 1975.

Sister served in many ministries during her Religious Life including Bookkeeping, Maintaining the Archives, and Revenue Sharing. She also served as a Member of the Housing Authority for the City of Boerne for nearly 30 years and was a Commissioner from 2007-2009. Sister Mary Lou loved children and cared for many. She especially enjoyed her time with the children who resided at the former Children’s Inn, which was located on the grounds of the Benedictine Sisters. Sister Mary Lou will be remembered for her joy and compassion, her wonderful sense of humor, her love for life, and for being helpful to all.

At Sister Mary Lou’s long-standing request, her body was donated to the University of Texas’ Health Science Center in San Antonio for the advancement of science and research.

Omega Retreat Center to Close

In late August, we announced our Omega Retreat Center would be closing at the end of June 2025. This decision was not an easy one. Omega has been an oasis for retreat groups and individuals seeking quiet space and time away from the busyness of life since 1982. As you know, many have called it “sacred ground”. The first ACTS Retreat was held at Omega in 1987.

The retreat center closed when the COVID-19 pandemic arrived in Boerne in the spring of 2020. It took a long time to resume operations, and even now, the center does not operate at full capacity. The loss of revenue has created a hardship. In addition, the high cost of maintaining the retreat facilities has become a financial burden for us. Despite the tremendous efforts of our dedicated staff, we can no longer sustain Omega. We are grateful we could provide space for spiritual renewal for so many over the past 42 years.



Always striving to be good stewards of our resources, we will continue to operate our other Boerne ministries, the Health and Wholeness Center and Sisters’ Attic Thrift Store, as well as our Caridad de Corazón border ministry in Eagle Pass and Corporate Responsibility ministry in San Antonio.



Groundbreaking News!

On September 13th, several Benedictine Sisters attended the groundbreaking ceremony of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic School in Boerne.

The 8-acre land tract, where the new school will be built, was formerly owned by the Sisters. It was sold last fall to Clarence and Tina Kahlig, of the Kahlig Auto Group in San Antonio. The Kahligs, benefactors of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church, gifted the land to the church for the purpose of building the new school.

“We are grateful for the opportunity to partner with Clarence, Tina, and St. Peter’s,” said Sister Bernadine Reyes, OSB. “Our Sisters taught for many years in Catholic Schools. It will be wonderful having a Catholic School so close to our grounds.” The new school, a \$28 million project, will house PreK-8th grade students and is expected to open in September 2025. *(above photo provided)*
